

EBH - SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

Chemicals

The Board of Trustees directs the Academy Administration to minimize the use of toxic chemicals for cleaning and pest control. Academy staff are not permitted to bring cleaning products or pesticides into any Academy facility without the approval of an Academy Administrator.

Seacoast Classical Academy will comply with the Lead-Based Paint Poisoning Prevention Act (42 U.S.C. §§4801 et seq.) which prohibits the use of lead-based paint in construction or rehabilitation of residence structures.

Water Quality

The Board of Trustees directs the Executive Director or designee to take measures to limit lead exposure in school drinking water and ensure compliance with applicable state law, and consistent with regulations and guidance of the N.H. Departments of Environmental Services and of Education.

All drinking water at all locations where water is available for consumption by students will be tested for lead and if necessary remediated in accordance with RSA 485:17-a.

Custodial and Maintenance Storage

Sufficient storage will be provided that allows the proper storage of cleaning supplies, tools, spare parts, unused furniture, equipment not in use, and other like items required for custodial and maintenance activities.

Environmental Standards

Seacoast Classical Academy will comply with environmental standards which may be prescribed pursuant to the following: (a) institution of environmental quality control measures under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (P.L. 91-190) and Executive Order (EO) 11514; (b) notification of violating facilities pursuant to EO 11738; (c) protection of wetlands pursuant to EO 11990; (d) evaluation of flood hazards in floodplains in accordance with EO 11988; (e) assurance of project consistency with the approved State management program developed under the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (16 U.S.C. §§1451 et seq.); (f) conformity of Federal actions to State (Clean Air) Implementation Plans under Section 176(c) of the Clean Air Act of 1955, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§7401 et seq.); (g) protection of underground sources of drinking water under the Safe Drinking Water Act of 1974, as amended (P.L. 93-523); and, (h) protection of endangered species under the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended (P.L. 93-205). Seacoast Classical Academy will comply, if applicable, with the Wild Scenic Rivers Act of 1968 related to protecting components or potential components of the national wild and scenic rivers system.

Seacoast Classical Academy will comply, if applicable, with flood insurance purchase requirements of Section 102(a) of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (P.L. 93-234) which requires recipients in a special flood hazard area to participate in the program and to purchase flood insurance if the total cost of insurable construction and acquisition is \$10,000 or more.

Text Messaging While Driving

In compliance with Executive Order 13513 (Federal Leadership On Reducing Text Messaging While Driving) personnel funded from federal grants and their subcontractors will adhere to the prohibition from text messaging while driving an organization-owned vehicle, or while driving their own privately owned vehicle during official grant business.

Human Subjects and Animal Welfare

Seacoast Classical Academy will comply with P.L. 93-348 regarding the protection of human subjects involved in research, development, and related activities supported in whole or in part with federal funds.

Seacoast Classical Academy will comply with the Laboratory Animal Welfare Act of 1996 pertaining to the care, handling, and treatment of warm-blooded animals held for research, teaching or other activities supported in whole or in part with federal funds.
